



## Thinking about finding your own accommodation in Belfast? Things to consider:

IH Belfast provides 3 types of accommodation:

- 1. Homestay (year-round)
- 2. Student Residence (year-round)

Homestays are carefully selected and vetted, and our student residence is of a high standard.

If you want to find your own accommodation, please think about these points... and speak to us first!

- Short-term rentals (anything less than September to June) are difficult to find and can be expensive.
- How was the accommodation advertised? You should consider only good property agencies.
- Who is the landlord? Be aware of illegal sub-letting!
- Who are you paying rent to? The landlord or tenants?
- Do you have to pay a deposit? You might not get this back!
- Are bills included? Probably not! Heating, electricity and internet will probably all cost extra.
- How are bills paid? Are they shared equally?
- Who will you contact to resolve any issues?
- What do you know about the other tenants? For example How many people share the house? How old are they? Male/female? How many bathrooms are there? How is cleaning organised?
- What language is spoken in the accommodation? Consider possible loss of contact with English speakers and how this will affect your progress.

<u>Note</u>: Many of the rooms available will be in university student housing and are of quite a low standard.

Living with university students can be noisy - are you ready for that? Consider how that might cause difficulties with how you want to live.

We strongly recommend that you only rent accommodation through a reputable agency. IH Belfast recommends:
